A tip from your OVW Program Manager Kara Moller:

OVW has announced the soft launch of two OVW supported TA web portals, <u>Domestic Violence Resource for Increasing Safety and Connection (DV RISC)</u> and <u>Law Enforcement Training and Technical Assistance Consortium (LETTAC)</u>.

In FY2020 OVW funded the Fund for New York's Center for Court Innovation (CCI) to establish a domestic violence lethality assessment to feature OVW approved risk and lethality assessment center, DV RISC, and to provide TA to communities interested in implementing a risk or lethality assessment or model in assessing their community's needs, addressing gaps that would hinder successful implementation of a tool/model, and selecting a tool/model. Also in FY2020 OVW funded the Institute for Intergovernmental Research (IIR) to establish LETTAC to serve as the new law enforcement comprehensive for the Office.
