Peer-to-Peer Engagements are facilitated opportunities for Grantees to collaborate with each other for mutual support and targeted learning or a particular topic. These may be organized around populations served by the Grantees involved or a particular topic for learning, and may be either short-term or long-term, with Grantee commitment.

The Underserved TA Project will be hosting a series of three Peer-to-Peer virtual meetings on the topic of Sustainability and Management Practices. We will discuss and problem-solve the application of management practices described in the <u>Sustainability in a Virtual World article</u>, providing opportunity for leveraging peer wisdom and experience.

Progress Reporting

Message from VAWA Measuring Effectiveness Initiative (MEI)/OVW.

OVW has extended the submission deadline for all performance reports that previously were due on February 28, 2021 (originally January 30). The new deadline for submitting your report in the Just Grants system is *April 15, 2021*. This extension pertains to performance reports for the July-December 2020 period.
