Stalking Awareness Month

January is National Stalking Awareness Month. Since FY 2017, the Stalking Prevention, Awareness, and Resource Center (SPARC) – a project through AEquitas– has been the OVW Stalking Comprehensive TA provider. In the last three years, SPARC staff and consultants trained thousands of professionals (law enforcement, judges, prosecutors, attorneys, advocates), provided TA consultations to programs on actively and intentionally



integrating services for stalking victims into their organization, and developing resources and tools for grantees and potential grantees.

FY21 OVW Solicitation

The FY 2021 Grants for Outreach and Services to Underserved Populations Program Solicitation has posted to Grants.gov and OVW's FY 2021 Open Solicitations page. Grants are made to develop and implement outreach strategies targeted at, and provide victim services to, adult or youth victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking in underserved populations.

Eligible to apply in FY 2021 are 501(c)3 nonprofit victim service providers and/or population specific organizations that are Deaf programs, LGBT organizations, religious minority organizations, and disability programs, as further defined in the solicitation. Applications are due April 1, 2021.

CUSTOMER SERVICE TIPS FOR OVW HELP DESKS

When emailing <u>OVW.JustGrantsSupport@usdoj.gov</u> to report technical issues with the JustGrants system, please include your DUNS. For issues related to applications, also include the Grants.gov number/Agency Tracking number (ex. GRANT12345678). This will save time and will also confirm that the first step (submitting the application in Grants.gov) has been completed.

When emailing <u>OVW.GFMD@usdoj.gov</u> to report financial issues, please include your OVW Underserved Grant number. This will save time and allow GFMD to know which analyst to assign the matter.

Progress Reporting

Message from VAWA Measuring Effectiveness Initiative (MEI)/OVW.

OVW has extended the submission deadline for all performance reports that were due on January 30, 2021. The new deadline for submitting your report in the Just Grants system is *February 28, 2021*. This extension pertains to performance reports for the July-December 2020 period. The extension should be reflected in Just Grants soon.
