Closeout Instructions

New OVW Special Condition

For grantees that have grants that are nearing completion, please see the attached closeout instructions from OVW. You can find more information regarding closeouts in the DOJ Grants Financial Guide.

There is a new special condition that will be a requirement of all of OVW's FY20 awards. This condition requires all recipients of OVW funding to have or issue within 270 days of the award date — a policy to address workplacerelated incidents of sexual misconduct, including stalking, domestic violence, and dating violence.
