Info on the FY22 OVW Solicitations from OVW Program Specialist Kara Moller:

The FY 2022 Grants for Outreach and Services to Underserved Populations Program Solicitation has posted to OVW's FY 2022 Open Solicitations page. Eligible applicants are limited to: population specific organizations or victim service providers that are: (1) Deaf programs (2) Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) organizations, (3) Religious minority organizations, and (4) Disability programs as further defined in the solicitation.

Applications are due March 28 in Grants. Gov and March 31 in JustGrants.

Please note there is now a 2-step application process, you must first register and submit some basic forms in Grants.gov then you will need to submit your actual application in JustGrants. The process outlined in the solicitation, including all dates, MUST be adhered to if we need to consider requests for late submission due to technical difficulties. MY BIGGEST ADVICE – submit early so you can work out any issues that arise.

I will be holding a live preapplication informational session on March ⁴h at 2 pm. It will include ASL interpreters and be recorded, should people not be able to attend during that time.
