Supporting Asian, Asian-American, and Pacific-Islander Victims

Host: <u>Safe Havens Interfaith Partnership Against Domestic Violence (Third</u> Sector New England, Inc.)

The goal of this webcast series is to further strengthen advocates and service providers' knowledge of different aspects of faith and how they may affect clients. The webcasts will also help advocates better understand how to partner with diverse faith-based and cultural communities. This series of three webcasts will use a question-and-answer format that will be moderated by Safe Havens staff. Participants will submit question in advance or pose them during the 60-minute webcast. This webcast series for OVW grantees will address three different intersections of faith and abuse: 1) supporting Asian, Asian-American, and Pacific-Islander (AAPI) victims; 2) the basics of conducting outreach to and building relationships with faith communities; and 3) Purity Culture and how it can affect faith-affiliated people experiencing domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking.

While it has long been recognized that domestic violence can have significant substance use-related effects, the lack of collaboration between systems often leave survivors and their families without ways to address both safety and recovery needs. This webinar will explore the way domestic violence and trauma can escalate substance use and dependency for survivors, and the impact of substance use on survivor safety and autonomy.

Self-Reflection and Racial Justice in Your Work with People Who Cause Harm Through Intimate Partner Violence (Part 2)

Survivors and people who cause harm are deeply affected not only by sexism but other types of oppression, including structural and systemic racism. Building on the importance of self-reflection, this webinar will define racial socialization and describe the ways in which racial bias permeates the unconscious of program culture, facilitators, and individuals. Participants will explore the ways in which systems of oppression – particularly racism –unique social dynamics and personal histories, including histories of trauma complicate the transformation process. The webinar will offer strategies for APIPs to integrate ongoing reflection on racial socialization and bias into personal practices and program cultures to create truly holistic interventions.
